IS YOUR DOG LICENSED?

The Town of Olathe Municipal Code 2-2-6 requires all dogs residing within the Town Limits  must be licensed. Dog licenses are available at the Olathe Police Department between the hours of 8  A.M. and 2:30 P.M., Monday through Friday. To be licensed dogs must have current rabies vaccinations. The cost is \$5 per animal (spayed or neutered) and \$10 (not spayed or neutered). Residents are limited to three dogs per household.
